Mental Health Self-Referral

The Pandemic has highlighted the need for mental health care access. As a patient of the Welland McMaster Family Health Team, you have access to our Mental Health Nurse, Social Workers, and Child/Youth counselling (through collaboration with Portage Medical FHT). If you would like mental health support, you do not need a referral from your doctor: just call the FHT at 905-734-9699 ext. 3 and ask to set up a Mental Health Intake call with LeeAnn, our Mental Health Nurse. LeeAnn will call you to discuss your situation and connect you with the services that meet your needs. Remember that mental health IS health!



Community Collaborations

Hope Centre – The Hope Centre serves some of Welland's most vulnerable citizens. This fall, through the generosity of patients and staff, we were able to donate 202 lbs of food!

Migrant Worker Clinic – From April to September, we held 10 health clinics for Pelham-area Migrant Workers. We partnered with Fenwick United Church to use their space, and we relied on the help of volunteer translators to ensure patients received care in their first language. To be continued next year!

Niagara Chapter-Native Women Inc. – The NCNWI provided us with orange "Every Child Matters" shirts designed by Indigenous artist Torrie Ironstar to honour Indigenous children who attended Residential Schools in Canada. We wore them on September 30th for the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

WMFHT Successes

The summer of 2021 marked a great advancement against the COVID-19 Pandemic with the increased availability of the vaccine. We did our part to help vaccinate our patients, beginning with a successful drive-thru clinic where we provided 161 shots. We then held many in-office dates where we provided an additional 99 shots, for a grand total of 260 COVID-19 shots given to our patients!

In July, in response to a request from Niagara Region Public Health, we provided 23 second-dose COVID-19 shots to Migrant Workers from 3 different farms in Niagara.
